The kids are alright – and this weekend they are showing how they can handle some of the most popular and difficult works in classical music.

Peter and the Wolf is a catchy cheerful story with music that has enchanted generations of concertgoers around the world. Peter lives with his grandfather and the story about his adventures with a duck, a cat, a bird and a wolf was created by the Russian composer Sergei Prokofiev in 1936. Prokofiev wrote it as a musical symphony for children and it has become one of the world's most loved musical entertainments.

This Saturday at the Shanghai Oriental Art Center local children (and their parents) will be able to enjoy the work thanks to the efforts of 300 students from Japan, Singapore, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Shanghai, all members of the International Schools Choral Music Society (ISCMS). The society is presenting the complete *Peter and the Wolf*, with musicians from Dulwich College, Shanghai, and the Shanghai Conservatory of Music.

One of the concert organizers, Joanne Brooke, said two drama stu-

dents will narrate the endearing story.

Prokofiev wrote the work allocating different melodies and instruments to each of the characters – Peter is represented by the strings, the wolf by horns, the oboe becomes the duck, the bird has a tune played by the flute and the cat is portrayed with a slinky clarinet air. The hunters and their rifles also have a special section of the orchestra set aside.

Major orchestras

Since it was written, *Peter and the Wolf* has been performed throughout the world by major orchestras often

with stars as varied as Sharon Stone, Sting, Patrick Stewart, Sean Connery and Boris Karloff narrating.

Peter and the Wolf is part of a concert that caps off the ISCMS Festival in Shanghai, the fourth festival of the organization which involves schools in China, Singapore, the Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand and Abu Dhabi. Since this Wednesday students have been attending rehearsals, performances and master classes, preparing for the concert.

The second major work in the concert, *Belshazzar's Feast*, is a very different and demanding work. This choral

work, by the English composer Sir William Walton, takes its theme from the Old Testament story of Belshazzar, the King of Babylon. Jews exiled in Babylon were tormented by Belshazzar who used their sacred vessels to praise his heathen gods. But during a banquet a mysterious message is written magically on the wall and later the king is slain, meaning the Jews regain their kingdom.

The music is especially difficult, even for an experienced adult choir, and will be a serious challenge for these talented young singers.

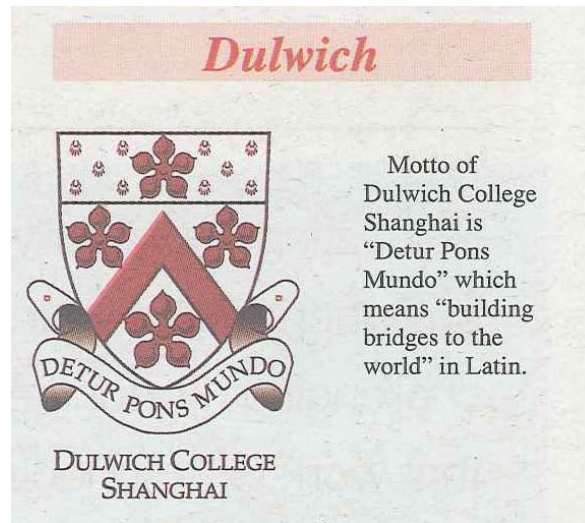
Brooke said that this is the first time a student choir has attempted the work. "We chose the best musicians from the member schools of ISCMS. We are giving these children who are really talented, a work that adults would love to try."

Before the concert, an explanation of the works will be given and the audience will be told about the different instruments and how an orchestra is constructed. "It will be a good chance to learn something about music," Brooke said.

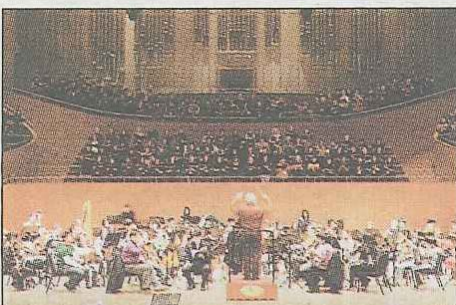

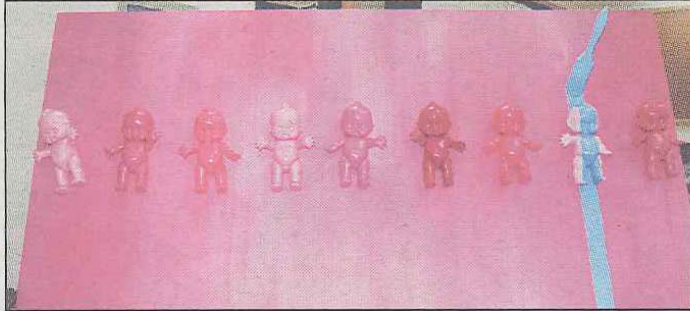

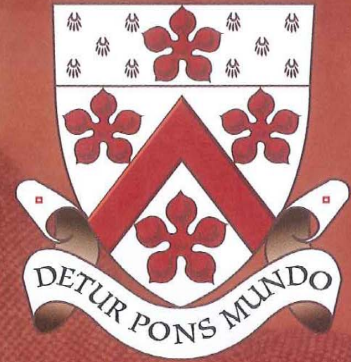
